Course Description

The overall goal of this course is to grapple with the key issues of coexistence in Israel, enabling future leaders to interact with representatives of different religions and cultures.

The course will serve as an introduction to the challenges and complexities of coexistence in Israel - where civilizations, religions, national identities and ideologies converge. The seminar will focus on five major aspects of coexistence:

- 1. The confluence of Western and Middle-Eastern civilizations
- 2. Religious interactions among Christians, Muslims, and Jews
- 3. Israel's international relations with Arab countries
- 4. Palestinian-Israeli relations in Israel and in the region
- 5. Relations among individuals, based on "universal" values.

During the seminar, conflicts will be personalized through interactions with representatives from many diverse groups, and through study visits to key sites. The lectures and discussions in the course will include geopolitical, historical, religious, cultural and humanistic perspectives. Conflict-resolution programs will be evaluated and civil peace initiatives will be presented, in order to motivate participants' activism in their own countries.

This program is organized in cooperation with the International Institute of Leadership.

Language

The course will be held in English or Spanish according to group requirements.

Course Requirements

No previous experience or knowledge is necessary and the course is open to every student with interest in the modern Middle East.

Students' Assignments and Grades

- A. 50% Active participation in the course. This will be based on interactive dynamics and an intensive reading of theoretical, historical, and "actuality" texts.
- B. 50% Exam.
